In the afternoon we studied coastal management at Hornsea, walking along the beach and navigating over the groynes and rock armour. Unfortunately, we couldn't visit the final sight as the car park had partially fallen into the sea, a clear demonstration that students were at Europe's fastest eroding coastline. ## MACBETH & POETRY LIVE! by Miss Gladwin

The English department are excited to announce a fantastic opportunity for Year 10 and 11 students. On Tuesday the 15 March we will be taking students to watch the tragedy of 'Macbeth', performed live, at Leeds Playhouse!

This is an excellent opportunity to revise Shakespeare's tragedy as well as analyse how it has been performed on stage. Leeds Playhouse have described the performance, in detail, here: 'Driven by his desire to rule, Macbeth does whatever it takes to become king. When three witches reveal their prophecy on the heath, a savage darkness consumes the hearts of the treacherous warrior and his wife. Corruption and an insatiable greed for power lead to death and destruction in Shakespeare's iconic tragedy.'

As an English department, we are also really looking forward to another trip we have planned for the coming year. In early March, we are going to be taking Year 10 to "Poetry Live". This will be held in Bradford at St George's Hall. It will feature some of the poets from the GCSE anthology performing their powerful and thought-provoking poems live.

This will include very familiar names: John Agard, Carol Ann Duffy and Imtiaz Dharker, as well as the current Poet Laureate Simon Armitage.

All these poets are fantastic to see live as their poetry is always performed in an entertaining and enjoyable manner. It's an invaluable experience for our students ahead of their GCSEs - the poets will discuss their backgrounds, influences and what inspired them to write their poems. Furthermore, they will also respond to student questions and discuss how their work connects to and influence other poems in the anthology.

Year 7 Girls Football Team - Nine Y7 girls took on the challenge of attending the first Dixons Cup Tournament of the year. A short trip to Dixons City saw the avid competitors take on several Dixons schools in three well fought out football matches. All nine of the girls showed real hard work and determination in every game they played in, displaying the Dixons Trinity values in true style.
