Industrial action by the National Education Union (NEU)

As we wrote to you about in January, one of the teaching unions, the National Education Union (NEU), is planning strike action over the next couple of months. This is a national strike regarding a dispute between unions and the government over teachers' pay.

The NEU has given notice to us that strikes will likely impact Dixons Trinity Academy on 1 February, 28 February, 15 March and 16 March.

Whilst we believe discussions are ongoing between unions and the government, which could see some strikes cancelled, we have had to make plans for 15 and 16 March on the assumption that action will be taken on that date.

Having considered the number of teachers at school who are members of the NEU, we have made the difficult decision to partially close the school on these dates.

Wednesday 15 March: School will remain open for years 7, 8 and 11.

Thursday 16 March: School will remain open for years 9, 10 and 11.

In addition to the above, we will also be open to any students who require enhanced support or who are children of critical workers. We will confirm directly with those families whose children will be able to attend school.

We have decided to restrict access in this way to ensure we can provide an appropriate level of supervision, education and ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of those in school.

For those children not in school, work completion documents and booklets will be provided which will be collected in when the students return to school.

If there are changes to our plan for responding to the proposed industrial action, we will advise you as soon as possible.

Whist the strikes may be cancelled over the weekend, and school would therefore be open as usual on Wednesday and Thursday, we wanted to communicate the proposed arrangements before the weekend so you can plan accordingly.

Thank you, as always, for your patience and understanding.
